

SKIN PROTECTION: As with any hydrocarbon product, oil-impervious clothing is recommended to prevent skin contact.

RESPIRATORY PROTECTION: Use MSHA/NIOSH approved equipment when working in areas of heavy oil mist. Ventilation can be used to control or reduce airborne concentrations of oil.

ENVIRONMENTAL AND DISPOSAL INFORMATION

SPILL OR RELEASE TO THE ENVIRONMENT: Combine and recover any free liquid. There is no CERCLA reportable quantity of Alpha-2 fluid. With small spills, absorb the fluid with sand or clay absorbent, then flush the area with water. With large spills, contain its flow. A spill of any hydrocarbon fluid to navigable waters that causes a sheen upon the water's surface must be reported immediately to the Coast Guard National Response Center (800-424-8802). Failure to report may result in civil or criminal penalties.

WASTE DISPOSAL: Alpha-2 fluid, when discarded or disposed, is not listed as a hazardous waste per 40 CFR 261.33.

HANDLING AND STORAGE: Avoid extremes of temperature in storage. Store Alpha-2 fluid in tightly closed containers in cool, dry, isolated and well ventilated areas, away from sources of ignition or heat. Store drums on their sides so that bungs are below internal liquid level. Do not store in unlabeled containers.
